

Where might I find my course materials for FREE?

Reserves

- If the library has a copy of a book or other material required for your course, your professor may have put it on reserve at the library.
- Print reserve materials can be requested at the Q&I desk and are loaned out for two hours at a time.
- To search course reserves, go to library.rochester.edu and click **Advanced Search**. From here, check the **Course Reserves** option to search reserves by title, course name, instructor, and more.

Interlibrary Loan

- Go to illiad.lib.rochester.edu to set up your Interlibrary Loan account and borrow books and articles that we don't have access to at our library.

Open Library

- The Internet Archive's Open Library has a large collection of digital books that you can borrow for an hour at a time.
- Go to openlibrary.org to set up a free account and start borrowing books.

DiscoverUR

- If you can't find your course materials in the Course Reserves Search, try using **DiscoverUR** on the library website (library.rochester.edu) to search the whole library.
- Use the filters on the left to narrow your search. For example, if you're looking for an e-book, filter by "Books" and "Available Online."

Public Libraries

- University of Rochester students can get a Monroe County Library Card by going to any Monroe County Library System location. Visit libraryweb.org to learn more.
- Anyone who lives or goes to school in New York State is eligible for a New York Public Library digital library card. Visit www.nypl.org to learn more.

HathiTrust

- HathiTrust is a digital library with over 15 million volumes of books, journals, and government documents.
- Go to www.hathitrust.org to get started.
